

SRP PROJECT of the MONTH

DABB'S HOUSE MUSEUM-HENRICO COUNTY

Simmons, Rockecharlie, & Prince, Inc. was commissioned early in 2006 to design a complete renovation of the building that once housed the field headquarters of General Robert E. Lee during the Civil War. It later served as the police precinct for the eastern end of the county. The renovated facility includes museum space for exhibits, a historic renovation on two levels to resemble 1862, and also office and curatorial space for the County Division of Parks and Recreation staff. The building includes meeting space and a video viewing room for use by school groups and the general public. A sales area for the recently printed history of Henrico County is also part of the work. New Mechanical systems utilize variable speed heat pumps to precisely match the changing loads of the building as tour groups and the general public visit the site. The Office areas are conditioned by ductless split system heat pumps due to low headroom and minimal space available to run ductwork. New electrical and plumbing systems were also installed to modernize and update the building to today's codes and museum standards.
